




- The Eurosystem Collateral Management System (ECMS) will replace the 20 local collateral management systems of the National Central Banks in operation today.
- It will make use of components shared with the other TARGET Services and thereby help ensure that cash, securities and collateral can flow freely across Europe.

Why

- Single implementation of the Eurosystem collateral framework
- Removal of existing operational burdens among National Central Banks
- Single system to be maintained
- Contribution to financial integration



Rescheduling and status

- In December 2022, the Governing Council of the ECB decided to reschedule the launch of ECMS to **8 April 2024**.
- This decision was taken to mitigate the impact of the rescheduled launch of T2, which had been likewise postponed shortly before (now in operation since 20 March 2023).
- The different ECMS workstreams are overall progressing in line with the new plan towards the new go-live date.




User testing and migration

- Preparations are ongoing involving different stakeholders.
 - National Central Banks currently doing functional testing along with CSDs.
 - Next testing phase (so-called CTP2a) was recently green-lighted by the MIB and starts on 10 July. It will mark the start of functional testing for banks (i.e., monetary policy eligible **counterparties**).
- Staggered approach for user testing (i.e., testing scope to be increased gradually per feature and market)
